Second Life-saver

COULD you save your first life on Second Life? Paramedic students at St George's, University of London, are learning to give emergency treatment in cyberspace, using the virtual-world game.

Each week the students encounter a new emergency, such as a collapsed woman in the street, and practise giving them drugs, checking their pulses and using emergency resuscitation equipment.

The students work in groups which, Emily Conradi, the project co-ordinator, explains, is increasingly hard to organise in real life.

"Students spend a lot of time on work placements, so it can be hard for them to meet each other and their tutors," she says. "The advantage of Second Life is that it feels more real."
